Co-President Julie Garrow called the meeting to order at 7:10p.m. and welcomed the group of about 80 in attendance. Minutes from the June meeting were reviewed and approved by voice vote. Parent/student introductions were made as well as new committee members.

Treasurer report: The Treasurer's Report was presented by Pat Farritor. The Investment Account balance is \$74,000.00 and our checking account balance is zero. Spent about \$88,000 in activities in the past year. Pat also said that Peachtree software has been purchased and this will allow the tracking of budget expense and will print checks. Kathy Nelson reported that they had 116 memberships as off Warrior Days and that they are off to a great start!

Spirit Wear

Lori Kading and Bobbie Lower reported that the first day of selling spirit wear was great! Approx \$4,400 was sold on Warrior Day and more merchandise has been ordered. Help is needed with the OLD Brunch & Presidents Bowl, sign-up sheets were circulated. Also need about 20 people to help sell raffle tickets from 4pm to 6pm at the first game on the 13th of September. There are new bags this year and wind shirts. Wind shirts are special ordered but sizes are available to people to look at and try on. Pre payment is required.

Ticket Blitz is August 28th. \$6 in advance and \$7 at the door. Coaches and Advisers are in charge of sending students to specific areas to sell tickets. President's Report

Jamie Nold reported that open enrollment is closed and that there are people on a waiting list. 2100 students now enrolled at WSHS, 600 freshman, 570 sophomores, 434 juniors and 450 seniors. All staff in now in place. A counselor was added to help with the transition of the 9th graders. 9th grade teaming is new this year. This program is to help 9th graders successfully complete 9th grade and move to 10th with greater ease. This is a 2 year pilot program and the main focus is core classes. Todd Novak is the coordinator and daily meetings as teams are

planned. During Warrior Day, approx. 1600 student went thru the building. Jamie announced that WSHS met requirements of the Dakota STEP and is very proud of that accomplishment. Those in attendance were reminded that parents can refuse to let their student take open lunch if they wish. The Health Center is new this year; it is to provide help to those who might not be able to afford medical services.

Budget Committee

Ron Meeker stated that they have had 22 requests for approx. \$48,000. 4 are in process totaling \$26,000. 4 new requests were received the night of the booster club meeting. Everything is in process and forms are on the website. A reminder that activities are required to have at least 70% attendance to the booster club to qualify.
